By highlighting the beauty and significance of these trees, I hope to provoke contemplation on the interconnectedness of life and the imperative of environmental stewardship.”

While in residency, Tina will begin with fieldwork in Wilcox Park, combining on-site sketching and research to capture the essence of select trees. This initial phase will inform the creation of mixed-media pieces incorporating drawing, painting, printmaking, and collage techniques.
