With August on the horizon, many of us have settled into our summer routines—avoiding beach traffic, discovering a new café with refreshing cold drinks, or planning a staycation to explore museums and local attractions that often get overlooked. Did you know Westerly Library can help with your next adventure? Adult library cardholders can borrow [museum passes](#) that provide discounted admission to a variety of museums and attractions. Passes are available at the Circulation Desk. Whether you're planning a family outing or looking for a new destination to explore, the library makes discovering our region easier than ever.

Looking for even more ways to add variety to your summer? Explore our [Library of Things \(LoT\)](#) collections. Colorful acrylic plaques draw the eye to investigate the slat walls showcasing the non-traditional items available to borrow with your library card.

The LoT currently includes two collections. The [Adult collection](#), located on the main floor near the Circulation Desk, offers everything from practical tools and backyard games to birdwatching kits and other useful items. The [Kids collection](#), located on the Lower Level near the Information Desk, encourages curiosity, creativity, and hands-on fun. Borrow new characters for your Toniebox, check out a stroller for visiting friends and family, or try a musical instrument such as a glockenspiel, desk bells, or even an accordion. There is something for everyone to discover in both collections.

This spring, behind the scenes, library staff have been preparing something new to share with our community. Beginning August 1st, Westerly Library will expand its Library of Things offerings with the launch of the [Teen collection](#). Located in Teen Space next to the craft closet, this new collection gives teens the chance to try something new, explore their interests, and borrow items for temporary use without having to buy them first. From Bluetooth speakers and headphones to yoga mats, Switch Joy-Con controllers for gaming with friends, and more, there's something new waiting to be discovered. Teens can start borrowing from the collection after signing the [Non-Traditional Materials Borrowing Policy](#) at the Circulation Desk. Stop by, check out the new collection, and find something exciting to bring home. We're thrilled to introduce this new Teen LoT and share it with our community!

So, whether you're planning a summer adventure, exploring a new hobby, or simply looking for something fun to try, Westerly Library has resources to help you make the most of the season. Stop by and see what your library card can unlock!

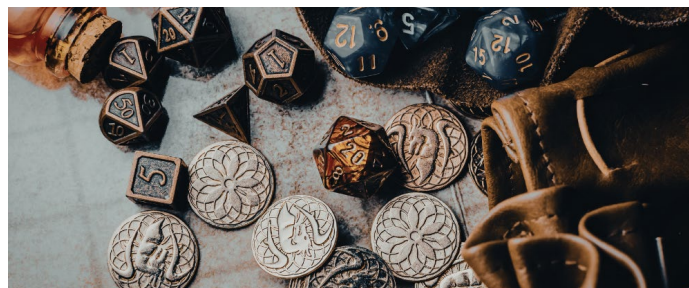

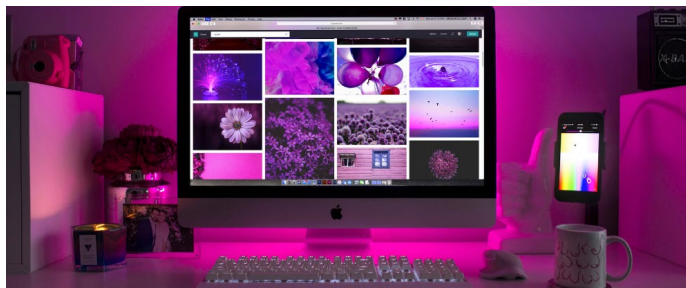

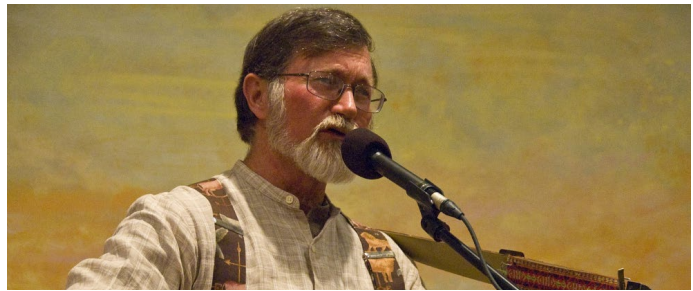

About the exhibit:

The “My Westerly” exhibit is dedicated to my friend George Kent. Back in 2023, I lost my wife to a stroke and I became a lost soul. As I wandered about the northeast, I eventually stumbled across Westerly. I remembered George Kent from my boyhood so, one day, I walked into Christ Church, found George and we reconnected. George's friendship and his mastery of choral music drew me to this town like a magnet and here I stayed.

About the artist:

People sometimes ask me about my style of art. If I had to choose just one word, I would describe it as childish. To me there is something magical about drawings and paintings done by preschoolers. They interpret the world around them in a way that is simple, honest and powerful with no concern for being architecturally or anatomically correct. Sometimes, I will labor over a composition if I feel that accurate details are important. Most of the time, I just bang out my ideas in water colors, pen and ink, copper, brass, bronze, steel, wood or junk I find on the beach.

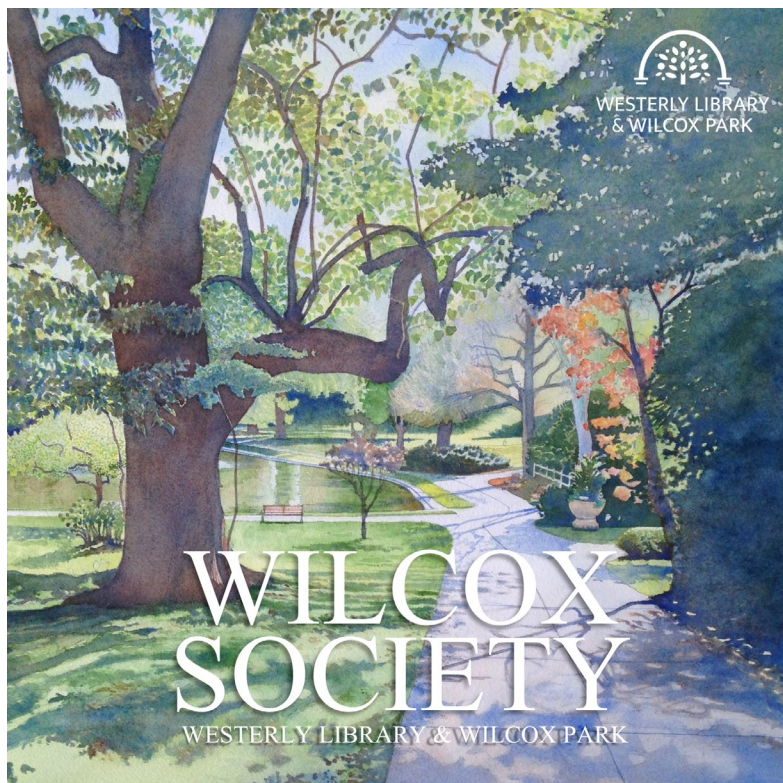
Esplanade
