About the artists:

William Butcher's paintings explore personal visions with images derived from life experiences such as landscapes from above and seascapes from below the waves. With the use of texture from various materials and the use of acrylic mediums and paints these images and visual ideas are brought to life.

William Butcher III is a professional photographer by trade focusing on portraiture and various commercial ventures. He is also a painter who is highly experimental with texture and the use of numerous acrylic paint systems and mediums. William's personal photographic work includes the use of a camera equipped drone and various other vantage points for his powerful imagery.

Drawing on an extensive background as a ballet dancer **Aubrey Feliciano**, who is also a college trained visual artist, has brought to life the wonder the beauty and the intense physical difficulty of this art form through her marvelous command of drawing.
