

from the executive director

February is Library Lovers' Month, which makes it the perfect excuse for me to gush about one of our community's quiet but powerful institutions: Westerly Library & Wilcox Park. Library lovers already know we're not just a building filled with books — we're a place of curiosity, a gateway to opportunity, and one of the most vibrant and welcoming public spaces around. For anyone who has ever wandered through the stacks, discovered a new favorite author, or found a moment of calm in a reading nook, the magic is unmistakable. If you know, you know.

For those who haven't yet discovered just how amazing libraries are — or haven't found that love of reading yet - February might be the perfect month to start. A few simple tips can help you ease into a reading habit:

- Start small with short stories or graphic novels.
- Too busy? Try audiobooks — yes, listening absolutely counts as reading.
- Pay attention to your reading style and what draws you in.
- Join a reading challenge or book group. [Ours](#) are a great place to start, and the extra motivation can make all the difference.

And don't worry if the first book you pick up doesn't grab you. Keep trying. When in doubt, ask one of our librarians - nothing makes them happier than helping someone find that book, the one that turns a casual reader into a full-fledged bibliophile.

One's desire to learn, discover, and dream keeps us searching for our next great read. Over the years, I've learned the types of books that speak to me: psychological thrillers like those by Gillian Flynn, transgressive fiction from Chuck Palahniuk, historical fiction by Kristin Hannah or Erik Larson, and the magical realism of Sarah Addison Allen or Alice Hoffman. Even though I know what I like, I still struggle to find new authors sometimes - but when I do, there's nothing better.

And of course, we're not just about books. Library lovers already know that, but whether you visit every day or haven't stepped inside in years, I encourage you to stop by and take a walk around. You might stumble upon something you didn't even know we offered - from our Cookbook Club and Art Exhibits to our Makerspace and Library of Things.

Library Lovers' Month exists to remind us to appreciate libraries as vibrant community hubs and to celebrate all the people who make them possible. Whether you're a patron, a donor, a volunteer, or someone lucky enough to work in a library, this month honors everything libraries make possible. And if you haven't visited in a while, February is a wonderful time to fall in love with your library all over again.











- **Scanmarker Pals:** Scans, reads aloud, and translates printed text in over 140 languages.





About the artists:

Multi Award winning and internationally shown photographer **Jean Duffy** resides in Hope Valley, RI and received her BFA from Rhode Island School of Design. Dean will feature her Infrared Photography as well as her Abandoned Series in this exhibit.

Eric Hovermale lives and works in Newport, RI. Although he studied to be a fine art painter, he has concentrated on photography for the past twenty years. His subject matter centers principally on the portrait and the figure.

Donna St Amant uses a high-resolution flat bed scanner as her ‘studio camera’, and objects are placed directly on the scanner glass with the cover left open. She builds depth and layers from foreground to background on the glass surface.

George Salter is an award-winning photographer and world traveler based in Rhode Island. For many years he has specialized in street portraiture in countries all over the world, using photography to share the stories of daily struggles and triumphs written on the faces of people in their native lands. His travels have brought him to such places as Cuba, Bolivia, the Philippines, Kenya, Egypt, Russia, India, Bhutan and, in June 2025, Ethiopia.
