It is Summer! Finally! And Westerly Library & Wilcox Park invites the community to experience a vibrant season of learning, creativity, and connection. This year's Summer Reading theme, "Plant a Seed, Read," beautifully captures the spirit of growth that defines both the library and the park. Rooted in the idea (see what I did there) that stories nourish the mind just as gardens nourish the body, we encourage readers of all ages to explore new ideas, cultivate curiosity, and deepen their connection to the world around them.

From July through August, the library and park come alive with an expansive calendar of events that echo the Summer Reading theme of planting, growing, and nurturing our minds. Families can enjoy nature-based activities such as Storytimes at the beach and Family Park Walks that make the most of Wilcox Park's scenic beauty. Gardening enthusiasts will find inspiration with our weekly Garden Club, or tours of the park and soil testing with URI Master Gardeners.

Kids and teens have plenty of exciting activities throughout July and August. The Teen Café gatherings, gaming, crafts, and DIY activity kits create a welcoming space for socializing and self-expression. Tweens can check out our new Adventurer's Guild while D&D is on hiatus. And Animation Nation, our stop-motion film making program, is getting in on the "Plant a Seed" vibe with a bunch of new LEGO Botanicals to build our movies around. Younger children can participate in storytimes, playgroups, and hands-on craft times designed to spark imagination and build early literacy skills.

Adults and older adults can appreciate wellness classes like yoga and stretching in the park, attending a lecture, joining a knitting group, or simply enjoying a craft and movie night; there are countless ways to stay engaged throughout the season. Summer Reading Lunch & Learns, each Thursday in July, will feature a talk by a different local farmer... and lunch!

Meanwhile, Summer Reading challenges for all ages motivate participants to track their reading, attend programs, and earn prizes, making learning both fun and rewarding. I mentioned the prizes, didn't I? Find details on how to participate here: westerlylibrary.org/news/2026-summer-reading

Our hope is that the summer programs and events at Westerly Library & Wilcox Park will cultivate a thriving, inclusive community where everyone can learn, grow, and connect. Both food and stories connect us to our family, culture, economy, and ecology. iREAD 2026: Plant a Seed, Read will provide a context for exploring culture, history, science, health, and human connection.

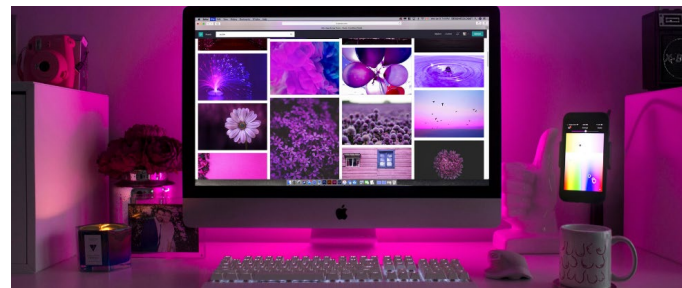

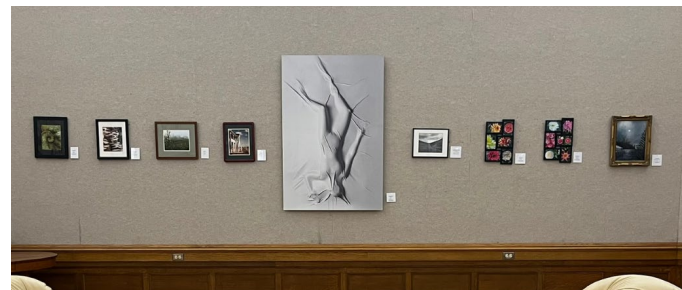

Dan is a poet of mind, word, image, thought, and dream, and has manifested this poetry in many ways, thus connecting us all in his web of delight.

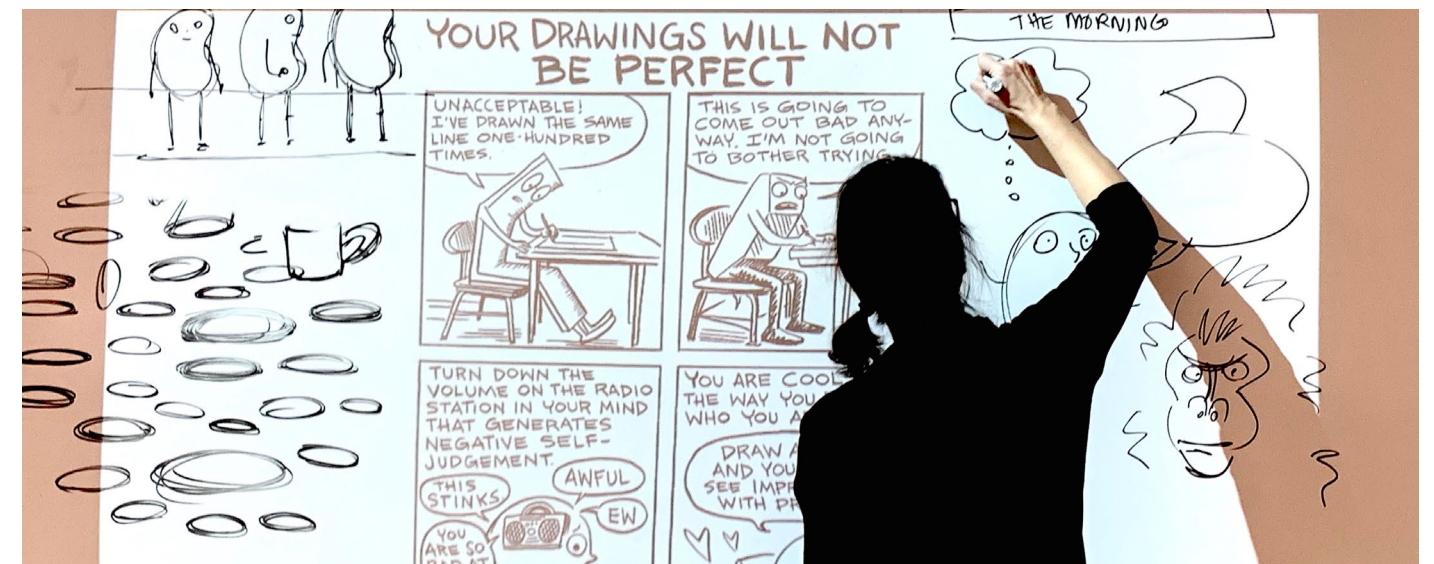

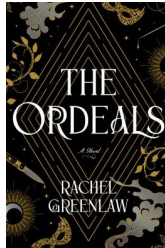

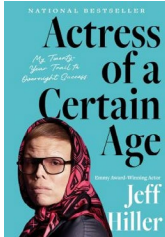

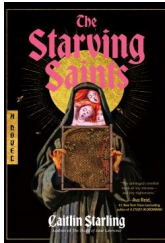

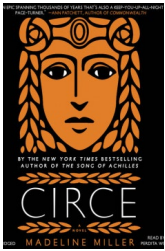

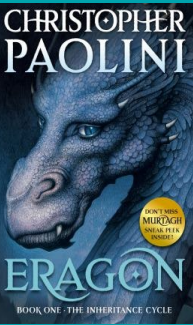
