## from a staff member

June marks the start of LGBTQ+ Pride Month! Celebrated each year in June, Pride Month honors the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan, a pivotal moment in the LGBTQ+ liberation movement in the United States.

Libraries have had a complex relationship with the LGBTQ+ community. Historically, collection practices and storage methods often resulted in censorship, with LGBTQ+ materials left uncatalogued or difficult for the public to access. Following the Stonewall Uprising of 1969 we saw a change from out of the closet onto the shelves!

In 1970, librarians Janet Cooper and Israel Fishman met at the annual American Library Association conference to establish the organization's first official gay and lesbian caucus. This soon evolved into the Gay Liberation Task Force, the first group of its kind within any national professional organization!

# hanging in the hoxie



## Biblioquilts with Larry Clifford: "Off the Shelf"

This month's exhibit will feature works by Maine artist, Larry Clifford! Head to the Hoxie Gallery from 1-3 pm Saturday, May 30<sup>th</sup> for a presentation and demo with the artist. Works can be viewed in the Hoxie Gallery from Saturday, May 30<sup>th</sup>-Thursday, June 25<sup>th</sup> during library hours.

"My BiblioQuilts and murals are created using distressed books that were salvaged from basements, attics, and public libraries throughout Maine. I repurpose every part of the books I find—the covers, the pages, the spines—breathing new life into my materials with the addition of dyes, inks, and acrylics. Postcards, maps, and other ephemera may be tempting, but I restrict my palette to neglected books. That's what makes the work both challenging and unique.

Quilts made from recycled cloth are nothing new. But the combination of mixed media and repurposed books presents a whole new challenge. Each piece is comprised of thousands of "tiles" that were meticulously hand-cut from discarded or damaged hardcovers – books that no one has read or paid attention to in decades. Most were on their way to the landfill. I carry an inventory of pre-made BiblioQuilts, and I collaborate with families, libraries, and communities on commissioned pieces and murals. My goal is to create original works of art that evoke warm memories for everyone involved."

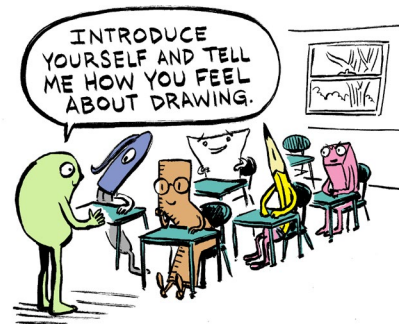

Cara Bean is a cartoonist, art educator, and the author of *Here I Am, I Am Me: An Illustrated Guide to Mental Health*. Her book was named to the Children's Book Council's 2025 Favorites lists for both Middle Grade and Teacher Favorites and was shortlisted for the Graphic Medicine International Comics Awards. Cara leads interactive workshops that spark creativity for people of all ages and backgrounds, with a special focus on how drawing can nurture mindfulness and imagination.

"In my upcoming work "Why Draw?", I explore the true heartbeat of a creative practice: the idea that drawing is not about a "good" picture, but about the curiosity and confidence gained through the process. As a cartoonist, I will communicate these ideas directly to the reader through panels, word balloons, and storytelling.



I view the sketchbook as a playground for the mind—a sanctuary where we can be messy, experimental, and entirely ourselves. For many of us, the inner critic and the pressure of perfectionism act as barriers to expression. My work focuses on dismantling those hurdles and championing the doodle as a vital tool for confidence and clarity.

Ultimately, this project is a celebration of the everyday practice. Whether you are a lifelong artist or haven't picked up a pencil in years, I want to show that the real magic isn't found in a finished masterpiece. It lives within the scribbles, mistakes, and the honest, unpolished moments that fill our sketchbooks."

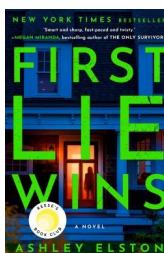

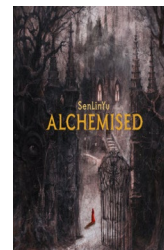
