thoughts from a staff member



I recently learned of the term “library anxiety.” Apparently, it has been a studied phenomenon for several decades, but I am just catching up. If the term is new to you as well, let me explain. Library anxiety is a feeling of fear or discomfort some people have regarding navigating a library.

My librarian colleagues have been familiar with this for some time, but as a fundraising professional I had no idea. In my role, I am accustomed to the diehard library-users who support our work through donations and/or by volunteering. These folks are typically familiar with the function and layout of the library; therefore, they are comfortable and confident navigating the space. Additionally, they often frequent the library enough to know our staff members, so they don’t feel nervous asking for help when needed.

This got me thinking about ways to combat library anxiety. If you or someone you know suffers from this feeling of uneasiness, here are a few tips to set your mind at ease before your next visit:

- Subscribe to *The Chronicle*. This monthly e-magazine will keep you informed on upcoming events, programs, latest news, and resources available at Westerly Library & Wilcox Park.
- When in doubt, ask our staff! We’re friendly and we want to help.
- If navigating call numbers, author names, and book titles is overwhelming, use the online catalog to place items on hold in advance. You can do this with your computer, tablet, or smart phone and your library card. Our staff will place your item(s) on the Hold Shelf for pick-up on the 1st floor- alphabetized by your last name.
- Wander. Stop in and simply walk around without the pressure of searching for anything in particular. Read the wayfinding signage, check out the Staff Picks and other themed recommendation displays throughout the building, or pop into each room that is open to the public just to see what’s inside. Release yourself from the expectation of checking out an item and just explore what we have to offer.
- Does the vastness of our library stress you out? Ask for a tour! You can contact me directly at 401-596-2877 Ext. 322 or sjackson@westerlylibrary.org to schedule a tour.

I hope this is helpful for anyone who feels overwhelmed in the library, where all are welcome.

March Exhibition | Italy Seen: Drawings by Josephine and Brian Dougan

This month's exhibit will feature drawings by local artists Josephine and Brian Dougan! Head to the Hoxie Gallery from 5-7 pm Wednesday, March 4th for an opportunity to meet the artists and enjoy light bites. Works can be viewed in the Hoxie Gallery from Wednesday, March 4th-Friday, March 27th during library hours.

About the exhibition:

“The exhibition in the Hoxie Gallery consists of a collection of in situ drawings made over the course of twenty years while conducting a study abroad summer course for the American University of Sharjah College of Architecture, Art and Design. Professor Dougan ran a three-credit seeing/drawing course in Tuscany and Umbria for CAAD students every summer for twenty years until interrupted by the covid pandemic. It was a supplement to student's graphic education and an opportunity to experience a culture distant from the far east. In the initial years, Josephine was an elementary school student, but it did not take long for her to grow into a keen observational drawer far beyond her years. We worked in museums, churches, castles, piazzas, restaurants and wherever something caught our eyes. We used sketchbooks and Italian Fabriano folio sheets. Collected in the Hoxie Gallery are some of the individual sheets and we hope to share the sketchbook pages at another time. The drawings were made quickly with an attitude that quantity provides quality. The results are rather personal, not intended to be showpieces. The objective is to use a pen to see that which one would not see without careful attention; to discover one's place in relation to the unknown.”
