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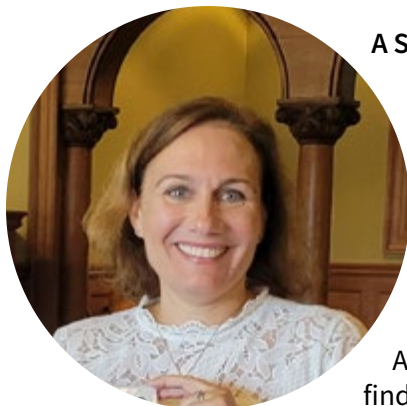
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# from the executive director

## A Season of Gratitude: November Reflections from Your Library Director



Westerly Library & Wilcox Park has always been more than just a building filled with books and a landscape with some trees and flowers; they are places of connection, discovery, and support. Whether you're cozying up with a novel that stirs your imagination, attending a storytime with your little ones, taking a stroll through the park, or using our resources to learn something new, we are honored to be part of your journey.

As the crisp air of November settles in and golden leaves blanket Wilcox Park, we find ourselves entering a season of reflection and gratitude. This month, more than any other, invites us to pause, take stock of what we cherish, and give thanks - for our families, our friends, our community, and the shared spaces that bring us together. This month, we're hosting a series of events that celebrate the spirit of giving, appreciation, family, community, and connection.

Family Stories Month occurs every November to encourage families to connect by sharing their unique stories, traditions, and memories. It's a time to appreciate and pass down family history and strengthen bonds between family members. We will be sharing in this celebration of family history through book displays, special crafts, and storytime. If you are interested in family stories, whether your own or others, consider viewing the Hoxie Gallery exhibit this month that features a retrospective of the works of Fuller Potter, curated by his proud family or attending the Dante Society program "The Story of Del's: from Naples to Rhode Island" about the family behind the famous Del's Lemonade.

Always on the second Wednesday of each month, attendees come together with prepared dishes and share their experiences with recipes. However, this program celebrates community over perfection, emphasizing joy, creativity, and connection rather than traditional family obligations or culinary expertise. We will be offering our first Gingerbread House Contest! There will be a limited number of kits available for free to build, decorate, and display. You may also make your own to enter. On small business Saturday, November 29th, we will hold our Annual Tree Lighting in the park where we gather together to celebrate the upcoming season of togetherness, joy, and gratitude through song, comforting goodies, and the magical lighting of a live park tree. That same day we will also have our Make Your Own Wreath event, an Ugly Sweater decorating program for all ages, and a Family Movie Matinee which will be a recurring monthly movie program featuring generational favorites. You can also sign up for our special Wreath Decorating Workshop fundraiser being held on December 4th.

As we gather around tables and share meals this month, let's also remember the quiet, everyday places that nurture our well-being. The library and the park are here for you, not just in November, but all year long. We're thankful for your continued support, your curiosity, and your presence in our shared spaces.

## Other Ways to Give

From the start, the Memorial and Library Association was established as a private nonprofit organization, as opposed to a municipal public library. Local industrialist-inventor, Stephen Wilcox and his wife Harriet, donated the land on which the library is situated, as well as \$10,000 for the construction of the building. The remaining cost was matched by citizens of the community. It is a testament to our community that so many individuals chipped in to construct what is arguably the most iconic building in downtown Westerly. This stunning architectural work of art opened to the public in 1894.

In 1898, Harriet Wilcox purchased property surrounding the library and donated the land to the Association to establish Wilcox Park. The park was dedicated in memory of Stephen Wilcox, who sadly passed away before construction of the library was complete.

Philanthropic community members have long been the backbone of our organization. To this day, Westerly Library & Wilcox Park raises funds

from individual donors through our Annual Fund campaign and fundraising events. Our Annual Fund supports programs, services, and resources that our patrons rely on. Our fundraising goal is \$282,000 for this fiscal year, which runs from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

Just as the Association has expanded and evolved to serve the needs of our community, we also strive to fit the philanthropic goals of our donors. With this in mind, we accept a variety of giving methods such as:

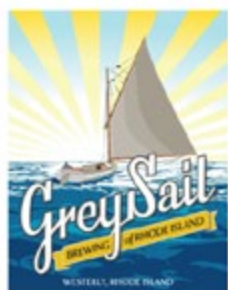

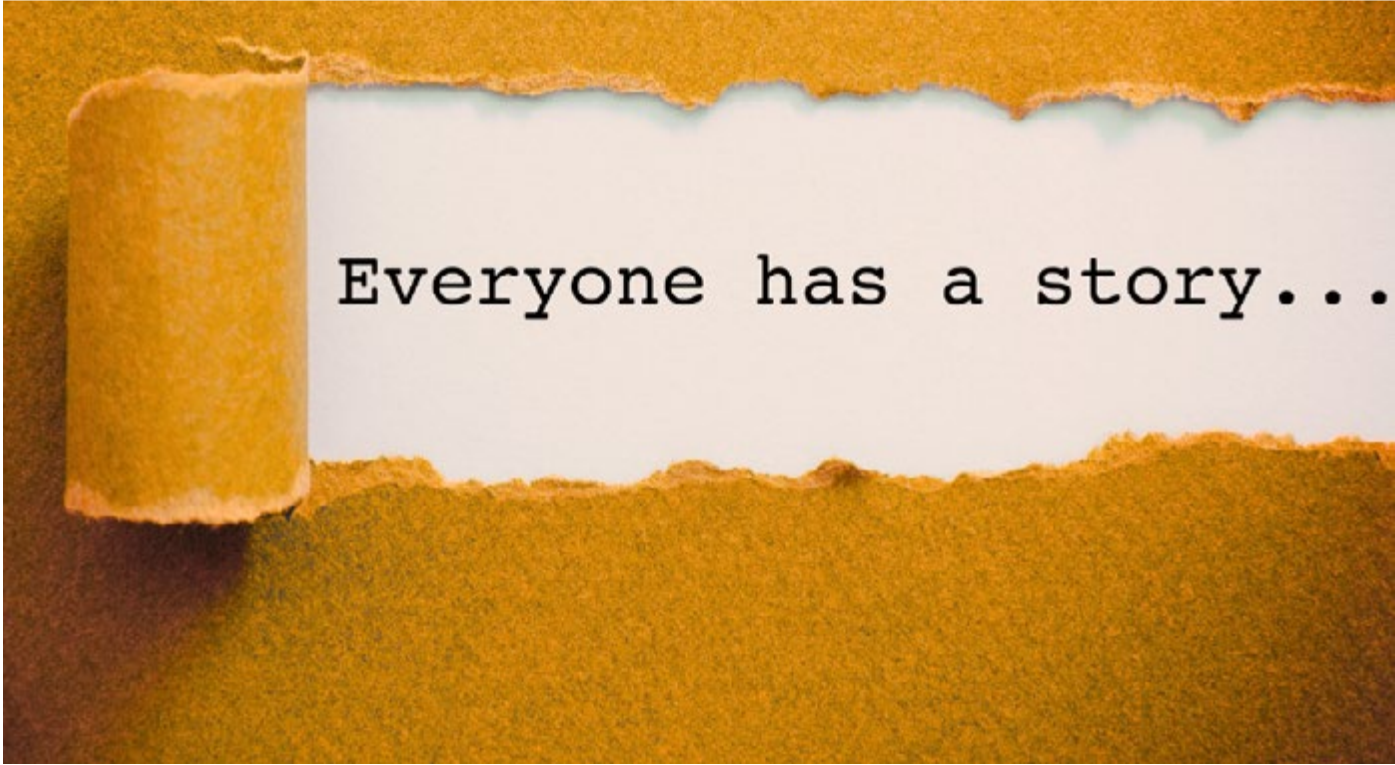

# hanging in the hoxie

## November Exhibition | “A Fuller Show”



This month's exhibit will feature a collection of works done by the late Fuller Potter. Head to the Hoxie Gallery from 5-7 pm Wednesday, November 5th to for an opportunity to view his works and enjoy light refreshments with members of his family. His pieces can be viewed in the Hoxie Gallery through the month of November during library hours.

### **About the artist:**

Fuller Potter (father of artist Dan Potter), was an abstract expressionist in his mid to later years, but had experimented with a range of styles, including landscape and portraiture. Fuller was renowned locally, for his art, for his eccentric ways, for his delight in people, for his explorations, and he and his wife Alice (also an artist), were part of the Stonington Community. Their children and grandchildren and great grandchildren all carry on the tradition of being artists in one medium or another. He was born in 1910, in NYC, and died in 1990 in Ledyard, CT.
