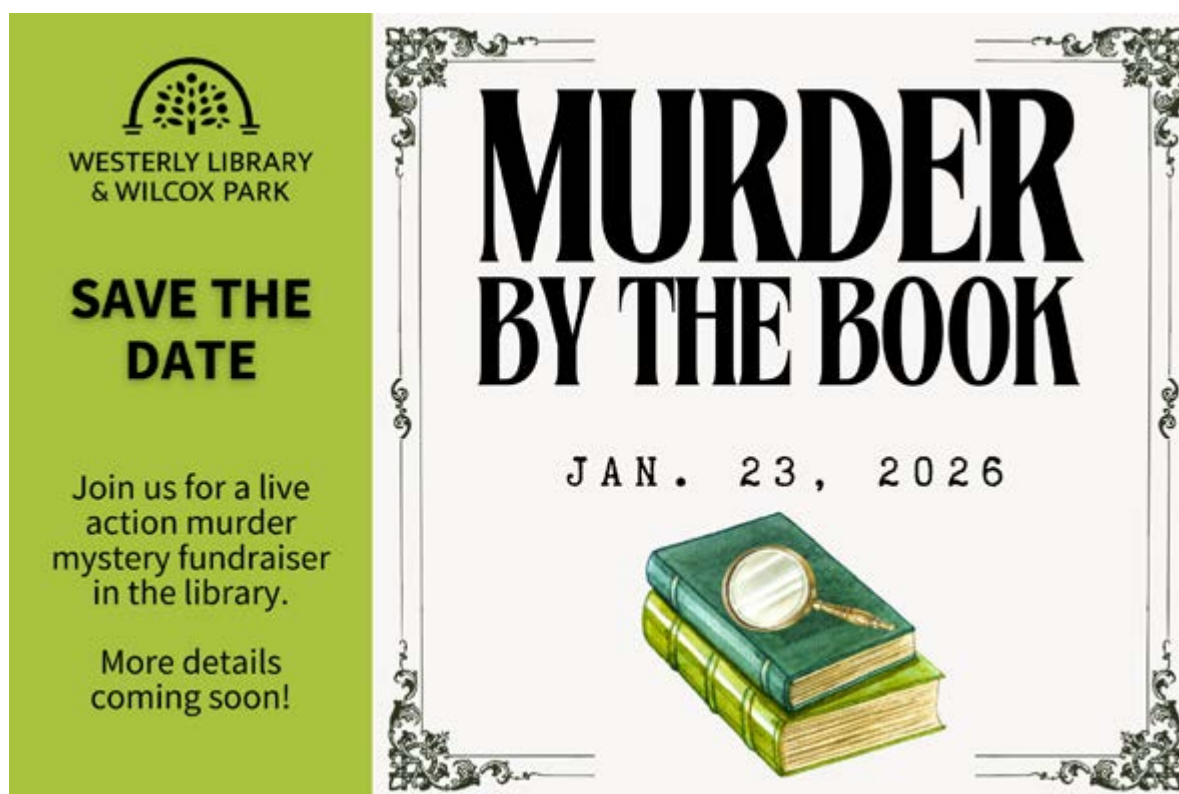

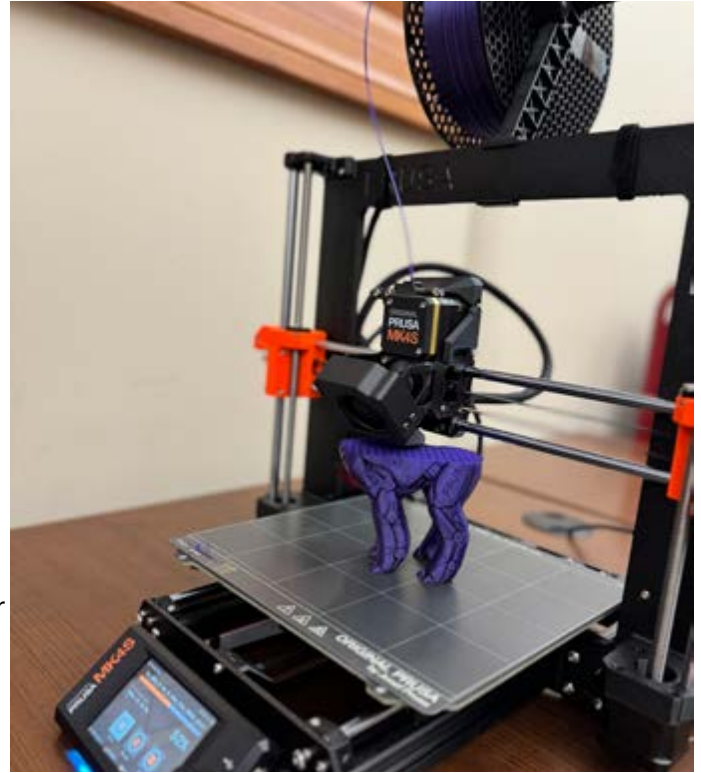
New Makerspace Offering

Whether you're prototyping a design, printing parts for a school project, or exploring 3D modeling as a hobby, it's ready to bring your ideas to life. Maybe you need a replacement part for a home improvement project, or you'd like to create your own fantasy game character, we have resources available to help you develop your ideal project or find inspiration.

Here are some specifics for you:

- We use PLA filament in various colors
- It costs \$0.10/gram of filament
- An SVG file and completed form will get you started
- Printing objects which violate the law, are obscene, or pose a danger to others are not permitted

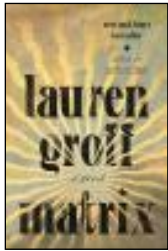

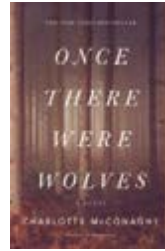

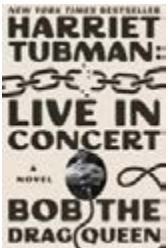
